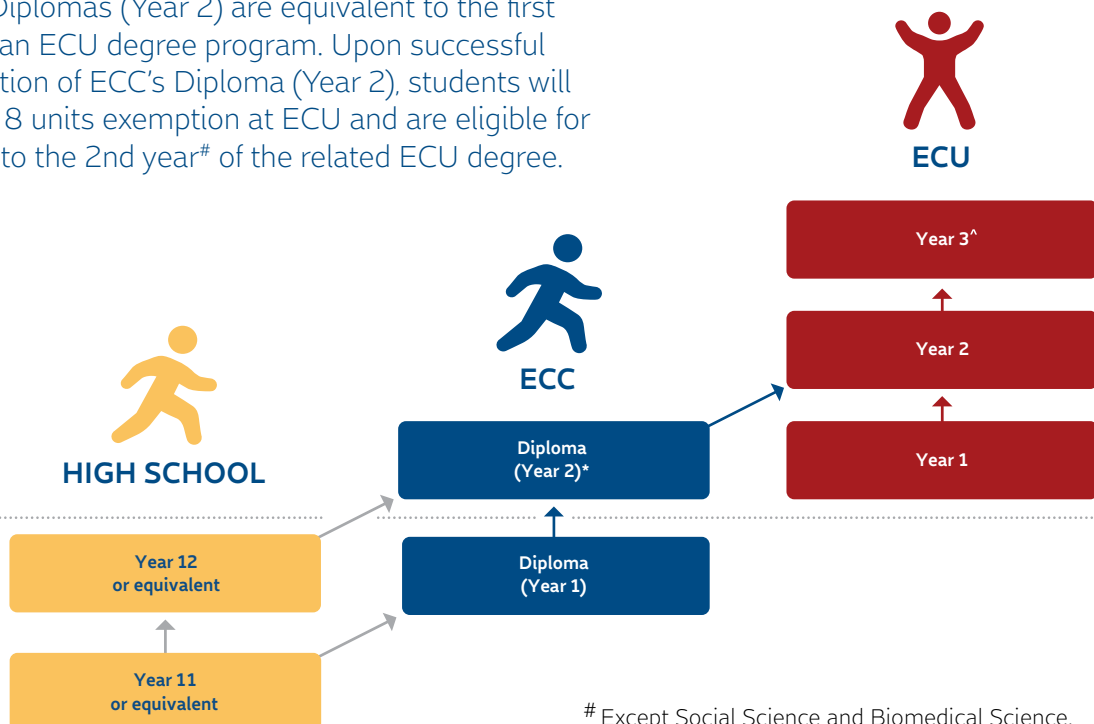

Edith Cowan College (ECC) provides alternative pathways to Edith Cowan University (ECU) for students who may not gain direct entry into a degree program and are looking for a supportive learning environment. ECC is located in Building 80, ECU Joondalup Campus West. Students at ECC have access to ECU libraries, eLabs, medical facilities, cafes, sport facilities, security service and many more.

Year 12 graduates can be offered a place at ECC, regardless of whether they have completed General subjects or ATAR. Upon completion of the Diploma program at ECC, you will gain entry into year 2[#] at Edith Cowan University.

Your ECU Pathway

ECC's Diplomas (Year 2) are equivalent to the first year of an ECU degree program. Upon successful completion of ECC's Diploma (Year 2), students will receive 8 units exemption at ECU and are eligible for entry into the 2nd year[#] of the related ECU degree.

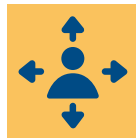
Gain direct entry to ECU

The Diploma (Year 2) programs are quality assured by ECU, so you can be confident that your program is of the highest quality. Students who successfully complete Diploma (Year 2)[#] are eligible for direct entry into the second year of the respective bachelor degree at ECU.



Study accredited programs

ECC is registered by the Tertiary Education Quality and Standards Agency (TEQSA) which is Australia's regulatory and quality agency for higher education. ECC's listing on the National Register confirms its compliance with the Higher Education Standards Framework (HESF).



Flexible trimester system

Through ECC's innovative trimester system, you can fast-track your studies and complete a one year program in only eight months. Diploma of Health Science only has February and July intakes.



Located on ECU campuses

ECC is located on the Joondalup Campus West of Edith Cowan University. The Campus is 15 minutes walk from the Joondalup train station. A free bus service is also available to take you directly to the campus. ECC's diploma programs are taught on Joondalup Campus West.



Part-time study available

If you need more flexibility, part-time study might be an option. You may also be able to change between full-time and part-time study during your course if your circumstances change.

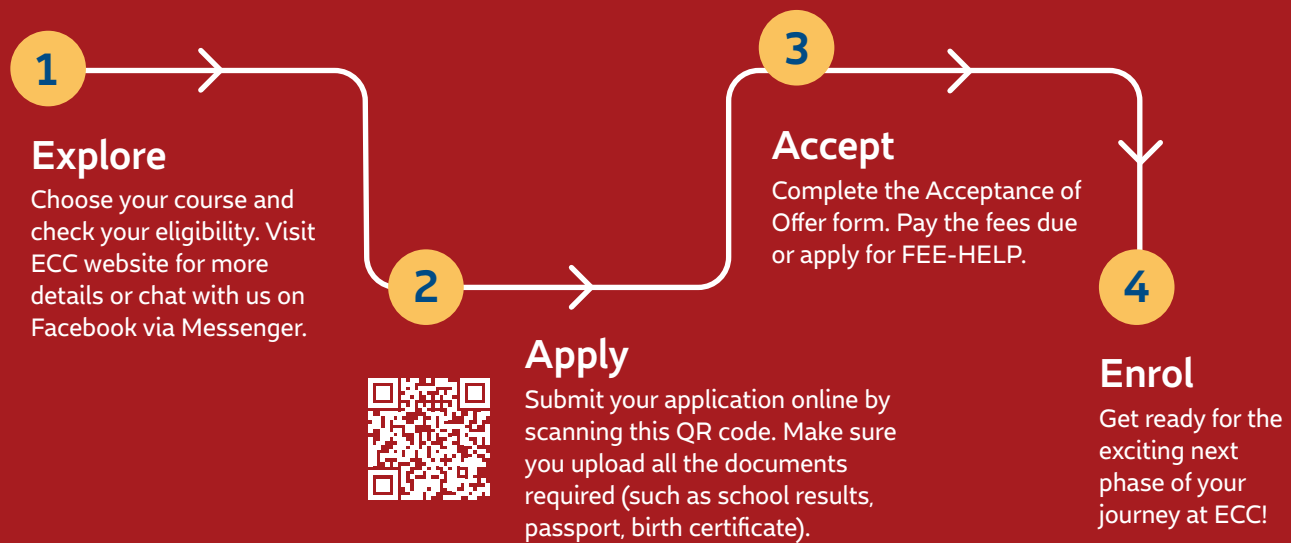

FEE-HELP

What is FEE-HELP?

FEE-HELP is an **Australian Government Loan Scheme** that assists students to pay their tuition fees.

ECC is an approved Higher Education Provider and can offer FEE-HELP to eligible students to assist them in the payment of all or part of their tuition fees.

How does it work?

The Australian Government pays the amount of the ECC tuition fees directly to ECC. You'll repay the loan through the Australian taxation system once you earn above the compulsory repayment threshold. For more information, please visit www.studyassist.gov.au/paying-back-your-loan/loan-repayment

Who is eligible?

To get a FEE-HELP loan, you must:

- be an Australian citizen and study at least part of your course in Australia
- be a New Zealand Special Category visa (SCV) holder or permanent humanitarian visa holder and meet the residency requirements - permanent residents can only get FEE-HELP for approved bridging studies
- maintain a pass rate of at least 50 percent
- have an available HELP balance.

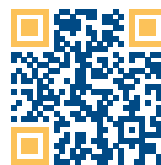
FEE-HELP loan fee

When enrolled in a full fee-paying place, there is a 20 per cent FEE-HELP loan fee applied to some undergraduate study. The loan fee does not count towards the HELP loan limit. The loan fee is applied to each unit of study.

How do I apply for FEE-HELP?

Once you receive your Letter of Offer, you will be given the option to apply for FEE-HELP. If you wish to use FEE-HELP to cover your tuition fees, you will need to complete the FEE-HELP form, Questionnaire and submit to ECC.

The census date is the last date you can submit your request for FEE-HELP or withdraw from your course without incurring a FEE-HELP debt (falls 20% of the way through the study period). If you do not submit your form by the census date, you will not be able to claim FEE-HELP. If you withdraw from your course after the census date you will still have a FEE-HELP debt which must be paid.
